# A Brief History

- Started in **March 2007** or so by Michael Aivaliotis and co. Lasted until **2012**.
- After panel discussion at **CLA Summit 2018**:
  - New **LabVIEW Community Wiki** started
  - Landing page started on **LAVA**
- **LabVIEW Wiki** revived **December 2018** and the LabVIEW Community Wiki was merged into it.
  - We have grown roughly 300 pages
  - Outdated content is being revised



# What the LabVIEW Wiki **ISN'T**

- A discussion forum or place for Q&A (go to LAVA or NI Forums)
- Replacement for LabVIEW Help (not build into the IDE, obviously)
- A code repository
- A replacement for other community content (blogs, articles, tweets, etc.)



# What the LabVIEW Wiki IS

- The **community** LabVIEW Knowledge Base
- The **first stop** to learn something new (including the “**Landing Page**”)
- A place to learn the What’s, How’s & **Why’s**
- A place learn the **history** and changes from various versions of LabVIEW
- **Links** to other great community content (ties our community content together)

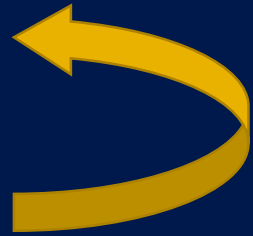




# How can you help?

- Traditionally Wiki's have a 90:9:1 participation ratio

- 90% Consumers
- 9% Editors
- 1% Contributor



Let's change this ratio!

- Where to **start**?

1. Find topics and **link your related blogs** posts/articles to it
2. Goto Tools : Special pages : **Wanted pages** to see what we're missing
3. **Start something new** (search to see if it exists, if not start a new page)
4. If there are differences of opinion use the **Discussion page** linked to each topic
